



While Buffalo, New York has had its share of blizzards, the one that hit at Christmas 2022 was one for the ages. Touted as one of the worst snow storms in 50 years, our friends at Oakfield Corners Dairy outlined some of their struggles on social media. Here is what Kendra Lamb had to report from the aftermath of the storm:

Hey friends! It has been a long, hard 5 days since the blizzard. Our calf facility was hit super hard by the storm. But, man, our village is beyond amazing! We had 500 calves in hutches and over a thousand in barns. The snow dumped over the hutches and blew into every barn.

Our first emergency was the hutches completely covered in snow. I was so scared that calves were suffocating. We made holes so they could breathe and then physically lifted 200 calves out of their hutches,

over the snow pile and wire while we still had whiteout conditions. Feeding milk, water and grain was a nightmare when we couldn't see, let alone get any equipment to run or get through the drifting snow. Kristin, who has cared for our calves for 30 years, hasn't seen anything like this in her time at the farm. Crazy!

Now we're dealing with the aftermath and trying to make conditions a little better for our calves and people each day. It's truly heartwarming how many people have stepped in and gone above and beyond to help. We are so blessed!

I don't post this for sympathy, but because many have asked how we're doing and because there are a lot of amazing farm team members and those of our "village" who deserve a shout-out! This storm was the worst, but our people are the best!


Opry. Along the way, they made many lifelong friends and Jean could always be found in the middle of the fun!

Rick and Terri Holdridge set a date to get married and found a farm to buy in the late 1980s. Feeling scared half to death, they walked into Frank Wood's office to make an offer on Deer Run, just one of the many Dreamstreet Farms nestled in New York's Catskill Mountains, in Bloomville of Delaware County.

Wood, accompanied by his lawyer, told the young couple they would own the 130-acre farm when they walked out of his office that day. Wood was asking \$180,000. "I told him we couldn't afford that much, and that I didn't think the farm was worth that much," Rick recounted. "He asked me what we were willing to pay, and I told him \$120,000 and he said, 'Okay.""

He found out later that Wood actually knew Terri's parents - the Inmans, of Mar-Bill Farms - and that he really wanted Rick and Terri to have that farm, so he made it happen. "Frank was very good to us; he left 30 cows here while we got started, and then those cows went to Ru-Ann in California," Rick explained.

Humdinger Holsteins began on April 1, 1987, and for the first 10 years both he and Terri had part-time off-farm jobs and used one full-time employee. When their three kids entered the busy age of extracurricular activities, they dropped from 80 to 40 cows, and shifted from full-time employees to some evening help.

Terri comes from a long line of dairy farmers - her great-great grandfather arrived from Scotland in 1850 and every generation since has been dairying in Delaware County. "My biggest asset is my wife, she did a lot of the milking and is a great tractor driver. And so, we do everything together," Rick noted.

Today, their children continue to be connected to Humdinger Holsteins. The youngest, Trevor, is the sixth generation of the farming family and is taking over the herd. Their daughter, Nikki, her husband Tanner and their son, live in Virginia, and she works from home and manages the social media for their Airbnb and the Humdinger Farm Store. Son Nathan is married


with children and is a math teacher in Rochester who calls regularly with the same question: "What's the latest on the farm?" He and his family also come home in the summer to help with field work.

Breeding Philosophy

The 50-cow herd is made up of 40 Excellents, 11 of them new and three new EX-94s since their most recent classification in November, along with 10 Very Good with nothing lower than 85 points. While their BAA is 113.9, Trevor does not consider that a measuring stick for his goals.

"I'm not after a class winner at Madison or the highest BAA; I just want a good herd of cows that I look forward to getting up and milking every day," he said. "I'm not going to set a goal according to someone else's opinion. Yes, I want good cows, but being the highest on the BAA list is not my goal. You can't compete with some of these farms with their BAA and their show strings."

With cow families like, Adeen, Ashlyn, the Roxys, the Lulu's, Talent

Licorice, Tamara, Rae, Audrey Posch, the family at Lylehaven Broker Mandy, Atlee, Team Durham Morgan, James Rose, Barracuda and Sid Chardonnay represented in his barn, Trevor breeds for balance, good udders and functional feet and legs. "I like show cows, but that's not where it's at for me. I want the potential of getting a really good cow out of my worst cow,"

he explained. "I want to be able to show a person my worst cow and not be embarrassed.

"I use a lot of bulls because I don't want to put all my eggs in one basket. I have several cow families in the barn, so I can't say that one bull works on every family the same way." Trevor listed the bulls he has used recently, including Altitude, Jordy, Milio, Blackwood,

Diamondback, Warrior, Denver, Analyst, Fitters Choice, Doc, Moovin and Sidekick. The older bulls he continues to use are Crush, Aftershock, McCutchen, Gold Chip, Atwood, and Doorman.

"Back in the index days, when anyone could compete, we paid off part of the farm with an animal that we sold," Rick said. "We got into the Cletus Grace family from

"The store boomed during Covid and people were very respectful of each other. Since, it has slowed down a bit but we are still having trouble keeping it stocked," she noted.





Mar-Bill with a Bellwood daughter. Gary Janson of Golden Oaks came out from Illinois and purchased one from us for \$40,000, and that helped pay a third of the farm off."

While Trevor manages the herd, Rick sometimes offers sage advice. A cow named Probably is an example of this. "When Probably was born, I was just starting to pay attention to sires and what they bring to the herd," Trevor explained. "I noticed she was sired

by Copper, and I asked, 'Dad, who the heck is Copper? And why'd you use him?' And he replied, 'I don't know but you should name her Probably because she probably will be a good one." Probably is now EX-94.

One cow family who has done well for Humdinger Holsteins is Jerricho Dairy Byway Carat EX-94 2E. She's out of an EX-91 3-Yr-Old Destry, then an EX-91 Dundee, then Manavale Lindy Carol-ET EX-94 5E



and then an EX-94 3E GMD Matador daughter. At 4-02 and in 364 days she has a record of 37,880M 1479F 1192P. The six-year-old Byway has had 4 calves and is due in February to sexed Jordy. "Her oldest daughter is a VG-88 2-Yr-Old Airlift and we really like her. She will complete a 30,000 pound record as a two-year-old and is pregnant to Gold Chip," Trevor noted. Two other daughters out of Carat include an Atwood bred heifer, and a Moovin Winter

Humdinger Holsteins are housed in 4.5-foot wide tie-stalls with tie rails that range from 55 to 60 inches in heighth. While the cows are on mattresses, they are bedded with shavings and hay. The heifers are housed in the tie-stall barn and calves are housed in box stalls. The cows go out nearly every day, no matter the weather.

The Holdridges own about 550

acres and farm a few hundred more. The milk cows are fed a TMR of corn silage and haylage. The family puts up about 30,000 small squares of hay per year. While they feed dry hay in their ration, they have a substantial hay market too.

Trevor's education in college was purposeful. "I went to the local SUNY college and learned things that would be helpful on the farm, but also I could fall back on if I needed to. I took plumbing and

heating, electrical, refrigeration and air conditioning and carpentry," he noted.

"What drives me? I love being around cows and I love being around cows that I love working with. I get more satisfaction out of doing chores than anything else. My goal is simple; keep farming. There are getting to be less and less small farms so we just want to survive and have fun doing it."





A LETTER FROM THE Show Committee

Whether you are an exhibitor, spectator, sponsor, volunteer, or breeder we are so glad to have the support of so many for our NYHA Shows. The Show Committee met in October of 2022 to plan for this year's shows and beyond. One of the goals of the committee was to get some future dates established for 2024 and 2025 as well so that adequate planning could be achieved. If you've ever planned any sort of event from a birthday party, to a wedding, to a cow show you know the struggle of a few things-the perfect date and perfect location rarely exist for every single person. In planning for our shows the committee weighed our options and for the next three years we are happy to be in Hamburg, NY for spring show the first week of April and Greenwich, NY the second week of September (exact dates will be published in the News and online but that is the general time for the events).

The Show Committee wanted to address concerns about the dates for the shows. We understand Spring Show might be a little early for people but the location in Hamburg provides a great facility and the weekend we are at the show is the only weekend available to us. We hope by having show days on a weekend junior members can still exhibit. We want a show that provides momentum for cattle heading into fall shows.

While neither Spring Show or State Show are centrally located we are limited in our options due to the number of head that are at the shows as well as other commitments that facilities have. Both Hamburg and Greenwich are very welcoming and accommodating.

To address member's concerns about New York State Show conflicting with the New York State Fair Holstein show we want to assure you this was discussed at our meeting. We want discussions around the topic to be NY State Show AND State Fair not NY State Show vs. NYSF. We are glad there is still a show at state fair, we are glad that it was well attended. NYHA will still support the show at State Fair in various ways. We simply want to provide another avenue for our members to show their cattle. We aren't planning and hosting state show to take away from any other show in the Northeast. We are simply providing another place to show, a competitive show, a show where we can get together as a Holstein Community.

The /ytel/e Difference

Traditional IVF technology based in Follicle Stimulating Hormone therapy can help producers rapidly improve a herd's genetic progress. It also comes with a steep price tag regardless of viable embryos obtained after flushing and developing oocytes.

"It's like risk-taking," said John Mikel, owner of Mikelholm Holsteins of Stafford, New York. Mikel is no new-comer when it comes to breeding and raising high show-type cattle. But as a smaller scaled producer, traditional IVF services were simply too much of a risk in cost and animal health.

Starting with his own cattle, he saw the benefits of a low cost, less invasive, safer method of IVF through Vytelle. Seeing the need and demand for a lower risk option, he transitioned the benefits he experienced into a diversification opportunity, using his existing facilities to open opportunity doors

not only to himself but to other New York cattlemen. His daughter, Emily is a lab technician for Vytelle, and her affiliation with the company also played a part in the decision to step into an IVF Satellite Center.

The oocytes are matured, fertilized, and then cultured in the lab over a period of six to eight days. Quality embryos are frozen at four different intervals to accommodate different rates of development. "The process is easier on the donors because it is minimally invasive and causes less donor stress," Bertsche says.

"There is a lot of competition in the IVF industry," Mikel said. "I can make my own embryos a lot cheaper and at a much lower risk. The cost is \$75 plus my barn fees, and then \$200 per healthy embryo. If there are no healthy embryos, the cost is still \$75 plus barn fees. You don't have to pay for the FSH and the labor in administering it. It's a huge savings."

Results are speaking for themselves as each donor is averaging five healthy embryos per aspiration. "Conception rates on the embryos have been good, and everyone we have worked with has been happy with the results," Mikel said

If one of the keys to a successful business is location, Mikelholm Holsteins has cornered the market. The farm sits between two exits off Route I-90, with only ten miles from farm to either exit.

Mikel's once-per-month collection day has room for up to thirty customers per service day. He is eager to share the opportunity for smaller producers like himself to capitalize on IVF programs through Vytelle's hormone-free system.
